



5-Steps to help you deliver the ANZ Game Save Match Program

ANZ Game Save Match is a program designed for 5-12yo's to help them learn the importance of saving and be rewarded for the effort. ANZ will be running a pilot of the program from September through to November 2015, for all registered ANZ Tennis Hot Shots participants in your coaching programs. As their coach, you will be crucial in delivering the program on behalf of Tennis Australia and ANZ and ensuring the kids get involved in all aspects. We've outlined 5 steps to make this process as easy as possible.

Step 1 – Familiarise yourself with the program

Head to anz.com/gamesavematch and take a look around to familiarise yourself with the program. When the Tennis Money Ball delivery arrives, take one out for yourself and have a read of the instructions on the packaging, this will help when you tell your participants how it works.

Step 2 – Receive Tennis Money Balls and distribute to your participants

The Tennis Money Balls will be delivered in early September and you will receive enough for all participants registered to your program in the past 12 months. Once you receive these, please hand them out to your registered participants and briefly explain the idea. There will also be some additional balls included for any participants who register after the first delivery.

Step 3 – Highlight ANZ \$10 match incentive

All children below the age of 12 are eligible for the \$10 match incentive from ANZ. Once they have saved their first \$10, a parent/guardian can go into any ANZ branch where they can set up a Progress Saver account. Once they deposit their first \$10, ANZ will match this with another \$10.

Step 4 – Encourage players and parents to visit the website – anz.com/gamesavematch

Once parents/guardians and participants are aware of the program, they can be directed to the website where they'll find activities, tools and tips to help them develop money management skills in a fun and engaging way.

Step 5 – Check-in (With parents)

To help encourage participants to achieve their savings goals it would be great to check-in with them and their parents on a regular basis. Ask questions such as; what their savings goals are, how they are tracking with their savings goals and if they've completed the online activities. This will help ANZ to understand the level of engagement kids are having with the program. We're happy for you to turn this into a game for your participants, as you see fit.
