### Item 11. General Business

#### **Division One**

Mike Hodge put forward the notion of playing Division One as a non-gender specific division – that club's nominate their best four players to play in Division One – this notion was put forward to strengthen the numbers and grades of division one.

After open discussion from the floor it was agreed to activate this notion and see what the range of players clubs nominated. The idea to be reviewed once player names and grades were submitted.

### League Manager

Mike Hodge put forward the notion of the AYC Scoring system to be returned to "Tennis Scores". This was proposed because of the many problems encountered during the season using "Tennis League" especially after it was rolled over from "Comp Planner" it became difficult to allow Captains' access to enter scores – many scoring anomalies occurred and the Stats were difficult to access.

Proposal opened up for discussion from the floor; Pros and Cons for each scoring system outlined below

<u>*Tennis League*</u>; <u>**Pros**</u> – no fee, Tas Tennis sanctioned, Tas Tennis available for IT support, processes being fine-tuned by Tennis League IT operators, system higher quality, already in use by AYC pennant easy to roll over information from last season.

<u>Cons</u> – prematurely rolled out, high administration needed by Mike Hodge during season 2015/16, Stats difficult to access, AYC pennant not exclusive in 2015/16

<u>*Tennis Scores*</u>: <u>**Pros**</u> – Administration simpler, has been used in previous seasons, quite a few AYC administrators familiar with processes, being constantly updated by Tennis Scores IT operators. <u>**Cons**</u>: involves a player cost, not technically as advanced, not supported by Tas Tennis, can't roll information over from previous season.

Mike proposed that he would have further discussions with Campbell Palfrey and reps from Tennis Scores and Tennis Leagues and the AYC committee. The AYC committee would decide which scoring system would be more appropriate for season 2016/17.

#### <u>Split Pennant</u>

Campbell Palfrey and Daniel Kaimatsoglu representing Geilston Bay and Taroona respectively queried why the AYC Committee does not consider proposing to clubs to run a split pennant. They felt that their club members would be more attracted to playing in a shorter 10 week pennant rather than the longer 20 week one being proposed at the moment

After open discussion from the floor it was decided that the AYC Committee would put two notions out to clubs about running two shorter pennants and making Division One non-gender specific. Club delegates are required to report back to committee of their club's standing on both at the delegates meeting on July the 20<sup>th</sup>.

#### Hi Players and Clubs

At the AYC AGM on Monday the 27th of June - two notions were put forward and discussed by the attendees. The AYC committee would like clubs to discuss these at club level and provide feed-back to their delegates for discussion at the next AYC Committee meeting on the 20th of July.

The first notion being that Div One becomes a non-gender division and played on lines of ability - The committee proposes that club's put forward their four strongest players to make up their Div One team.

The second notion is for splitting the pennant into two shorter ones. One Pre-Christmas and One Post-Christmas. Attendees felt that players from their clubs would find this a more attractive option for participation than one long 20 week roster.

The AYC Committee felt it fairer if these notions were put out to the wider club community and they will be guided by the feedback they receive from Clubs via their delegates.

#### **Executive Decisions**

Peter Hobdale raised the issue that in the rules quite a few decisions were ultimately left to the discretion of the AYC executive; being that Mike Hodge holding both the position of President and Treasurer lessened the platform of decision makers. Mike Hodge assured the floor that even though the rules stipulated this, more often than not the whole AYC Committee made the decisions and this was made easier with the communication advancement via emails.

#### **Dinner Numbers**

Steve Thomas proposed the idea of inviting the 4 top contenders for the most consistent players for each division to the dinner. To generate more interest and boost numbers at the dinner. Lisa Mckay also noted that if the AYC ran with two pennants this would also potentially boost numbers.

#### **St Therese's Evacuation**

Ros Williams made mention that St Therese's Tennis Club had evacuated their premises at Amy Street Moonah during season 2015/16. She has provided an anecdote of the situation for the benefit of the AGM minutes.

#### AYC Memories for St Therese's Tennis Club

The year 2015 was a particularly sad year for members of the St Therese's Tennis Club in Amy Street Moonah. A suitable lease arrangement could not be negotiated with our new landlord, so we had to vacate our premises after 65 years.
