Presidents Report

It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual report for the 2020 / 2021 season.

While it was a bit difficult to get the annual meeting organised with the restrictions placed upon us at the time it was good to get the season underway by putting an end to the two roster discussion for the foreseeable future.

This one had been with us for a considerable time with little real progress and it was a good sign for the future that the meeting confirmed the decision of the Tournament Committee.

While it is early days we have seen a small increase in participation. It may take some time to confirm any seasonal impacts, but the immediate benefits of including new players or those players that were not available for roster 1 into roster 2 have been realised.

Some problems occurred setting closing dates for the second roster but it has demonstrated that the roster can be put in place in a much shorter time frame than has previously been the case, this can only be a good thing as it keeps the whole roster compact from commitment to completion.

These closing date issues saw a few players miss the Division 01 cut and not be accommodated in teams elsewhere. We need to ensure that we work closely with Division 01 to ensure that everybody looking for a game is able to get one.

While not for everyone the Division 01 format continues to attract players and increase in standard, it has a number of attractive attributes that could be a model for future pennants.

At present we have three formats in use. The top is getting stronger, the increasing numbers are in the lower divisions, and with only four teams able to be included in Division 02 the lack of stronger ladies in the mixed pennant, once the only pennant we ran, is very noticeable.

Hopefully we can continue to constructively discuss the options that we have to increase the rates of ladies participating and potentially improve the strength of the mixed competition without a negative impact on those Clubs that have excess men playing.

The introduction of the 9 game mixed set to the mixed format matches has been well received and saw the trial continue into the second roster. It looks like this has been a welcome enhancement to the mixed pennant and I expect that it will continue into future rosters.

As usual, a few concerns were raised with the approval of fillins for finals. While I believe we achieved a fair outcome in all situations few took up the opportunity to provide any feedback on the finals process when invited to do so.

Thanks to the Sunshine Tennis Club for hosting our end of season event. Ours is predominantly a Club based competition and involving the Clubs for more aspects of the Association can only be a good thing. This year was a very successful event with around 40 people attending and confirms our view that keeping the Clubs involved is a good thing.

Our annual Championships and the more recent pre roster doubles have attracted a total of over 150 entries, a good opportunity for plenty of people to get a well organised game in. Congratulations to the many winners. A full list appears at the end of the Annual Report.

Next season is our 70th, a wonderful opportunity to celebrate all of the good things about the AYC, past, present and hopefully future.

Congratulations to Evelyn Van Nimwegen from Kingston, the very worthy recipient of our 2020 / 2021 Award For Service.

In closing I wish to pass on my thanks to other members of Executive and the Tournament Committee, their efforts over both rosters have ensured that the pennant is well organised and runs smoothly, this means that most of us can just turn up and play tennis.

<p>The bank balance as at 30th June 2021 is \$4,303.29 which is a decrease of \$608.50. The committee made the decision that it would fund the championships from surplus funds in the bank account as a goodwill gesture. One of the reasons that the championships were funded this year was that the presentation dinner for the 19/20 season had not been held due to Covid 19 restrictions. Interestingly even though the AYC season was split into 2 season as a trial for 2 years the revenue decreased by \$87. An administration fee of \$2,000 was once again paid to Campbell Palfrey in his capacity of secretary, tournament/pennant official. The amount is a gratuity only and does not come close to all the time and effort Campbell contributes to AYC each year.</p>
