AO 2026 launches with Million Dollar 1 Point Slam, expanded Opening Week and 21 days of music

Three weeks of world-class tennis and entertainment return to Melbourne in January with an expanded Opening Week featuring a world-first **Million Dollar 1 Point Slam**, alongside a reimagined precinct, a stunning array of food, and even more music and entertainment across the site.

"Australian Open 2025 set a new benchmark, and in 2026, we're raising the bar even higher," Australian Open Tournament Director **Craig Tiley** said.

"From the fierce rivalries and rising stars on court to unforgettable moments across the precinct, the AO continues to push the envelope as a global force in sport and entertainment. It's a platform like no other for our fans, our players and global brands.

"The growth of the AO over recent years has been extraordinary – we welcomed 1.2 million fans in 2025. That momentum brings a new challenge: how do we give even more people a spectacular AO experience? The answer is **Opening Week**, which we've taken to the next level in scale and experience for AO 2026.

"The entire site will be open from day one, when kids can come free of charge, and live music will light up Grand Slam Oval every night. Fans can claim front-row seats in Rod Laver Arena for **Open Practice**, offering rare, upclose access to the superstars of the game. Top players will inspire the next generation by handing out 5,000 racquets to kids, while 256 players battle it out in Australian Open qualifying, setting the stage for three weeks of unforgettable tennis and entertainment.

"I can reveal today that World No.1 **Carlos Alcaraz** will headline the pro player line-up in the Million Dollar 1 Point Slam – a thrilling new initiative where one point could win you \$1 million. Whether you're an amateur or a pro, the ultimate winner will walk away with the prize. Entries will open soon at clubs across the country, and during Opening Week, finalists will compete for a chance to face the pros on Rod Laver Arena. With more big names to be announced soon, you now have a million reasons to pick up a racquet and get ready for January.

"As we do each year, the precinct has been reimagined, and for AO 2026 we're quite literally taking it to new heights. The Highline is a new elevated viewing platform that will give more fans a fresh perspective on the action, additional shade to keep everyone comfortable, and easy access to the popular Courtside Bar."

"We can't wait to welcome everyone in January."

Australian Open 2026's three-week tennis and entertainment festival includes:

- OPENING WEEK will see the entire precinct open from day one for the first time, with affordable family tickets and free entry for kids on day one. Fans can enjoy AO Ballpark presented by Emirates, TOPCOURT, nightly live music on Grand Slam Oval, qualifying, open practice, four nights of charity events and Kids Tennis Day presented by Emirates. 5000 Hot Shots Tennis racquets will be given away.
- MILLION DOLLAR 1 POINT SLAM where 22 pros will compete against 10 amateurs from across the
 country for their chance to take home \$1 million. Qualifying will take place across Australia and at the AO
 during Opening Week with the final played on Rod Laver Arena.
- SHAKE SHACK's first ever Australian pop-up is coming to the AO. Shake Shack will be serving its signature ShackBurger® and an exclusive AO Shake, only available at TOPCOURT during January.
- **AO LIVE** will transform the AO into Melbourne's ultimate summer festival, with 21 days of music across the precinct from nightly performances on Grand Slam Oval, including Opening Week, to five huge

nights of international headliners at AO LIVE Presents in John Cain Arena.

- **THE HIGHLINE** will give fans elevated views, extra shade, and a seamless connection to the reimagined Courtside Bar for the ultimate tennis viewing experience.
- **DOUBLE STOREY GRAND SLAM OVAL** will offer more seating, plenty of shade, and prime views of the big screens, creating the perfect spot to soak up the AO's electric festival atmosphere.
- **NEW DOUBLES FINALS SCHEDULE** will see both men's and women's doubles finals played during the afternoon on the final Saturday on Rod Laver Arena.
- PICKLEBALL SLAM will be back bigger and better after its successful debut at AO 2025.

Australian Open 2026: Rivalries ignite, legends return and the next generation arrives

The stage is set for a spectacular summer of tennis as the world's best players descend on Melbourne Park for **Australian Open 2026** - a tournament brimming with blockbuster rivalries, historic milestones, and the rise of a new generation of global stars.

Australian Open Tournament Director **Craig Tiley** says this year's AO could mark a defining moment in the sport's history.

"We're witnessing the birth of what could be the greatest rivalry tennis has ever seen," Tiley said.

"Jannik Sinner and Carlos Alcaraz are pushing each other to extraordinary levels. They force each other to new heights every time they compete; their contrasting styles make for electric matches and they both fight to the final point. This is a rivalry that could define the sport for years to come."

World No.2 Sinner returns to Melbourne as the defending champion, fresh off a Wimbledon title and runner-up finishes at Roland Garros and the US Open. He's chasing a rare three-peat at the Australian Open, a feat only achieved in the Open era by **Novak Djokovic**.

"If Jannik wins again, he joins Novak in an elite club. That's the level he's playing at. But Carlos (Alcaraz) is right there. He's the world No.1, he's chasing his first Australian Open title, and with it, a career Grand Slam. That's a huge motivator."

And then there's Novak. The 10-time AO champion. The man who has defined greatness in Melbourne for nearly two decades. Still ranked No.4, still a force at the top of the game, and underestimated at peril.

"Novak thrives on defying expectations and adding to his extraordinary legacy. If he wins here, he becomes the oldest Grand Slam singles champion in the Open era, surpassing the legendary Ken Rosewall, and claims a record 25th major. That's not just adding to his already incredible honour role, it's creating history."

The women's draw is equally tantalising. World No.1 **Aryna Sabalenka**, No.2 **Iga Swiatek** and No.3 **Coco Gauff** are locked in a fierce battle for supremacy, with Swiatek also chasing a career Grand Slam in Melbourne.

"There's no clear favourite. Sabalenka's power, Gauff's athleticism, Swiatek's precision - it's a fascinating mix. Any one of them could dominate 2026," Tiley said.

Two-time AO champion **Naomi Osaka** has also surged back into the top 20 and loves the surface at Melbourne Park. World No.4 **Amanda Anisimova** reached the final at both the US Open and Wimbledon and **Emma Raducanu**, currently ranked 32, has a chance to be seeded come January.

AO 2026 will also showcase the sport's brightest young stars, such as Brazil's excitement machine, **Joao Fonseca**, powerful young Brit **Jack Draper**, sensational teenagers **Mirra Andreeva** and **Maya Joint**, along with **Jakub Mensik** and **Victoria Mboko**, all making waves.

"These players aren't just talented - they're building new fan bases around the world," said Tiley. "Fonseca in Brazil, Eala in the Philippines, even **Janice Tjen** in Indonesia - they're inspiring the next generation."

The resurgence of American tennis continues, with 15 men in the top 100, led by **Taylor Fritz, Ben Shelton**, **Tommy Paul, Frances Tiafoe, Alex Michelsen, Brandon Nakashima** and **Marcos Giron**, all inside the top 50.

The women's field is just as strong, led by world No.3 **Coco Gauff**, **Amanda Anisimova** at No.4, and defending AO champion **Madison Keys** at No.6.

"The depth in American tennis is phenomenal. They're not just competing, they're contending for titles," Tiley said.

Italy's tennis renaissance continues, led by defending AO champ Sinner, with **Lorenzo Musetti** at No.9, **Flavio Cobolli** rising at No.25, and **Matteo Berrettini** returning to form. On the women's side, two-time Grand Slam finalist **Jasmine Paolini** is leading the charge.

"Italian tennis is having a moment. They've got flair, fight, and a real belief they can win on the biggest stages," Tiley said.

Australia's own **Alex de Minaur** is coming off a career-best season, reaching the quarterfinals at all four majors and playing a starring role at the Laver Cup where he was instrumental in Team World's victory. He'll be joined by **Alexei Popyrin**, coming back from injury and ranked inside the top 40, rising stars **Adam Walton** and **Tristan Schoolkate**, along with **Jordan Thompson** and **Aleksandar Vukic**.

On the women's side, world No.20 **Daria Kasatkina** is set to be seeded, while teenager **Maya Joint**, currently ranked 36, is on the cusp of a top-32 seeding following a stellar year. **Priscilla Hon** has also just cracked the top 100 and is showing strong form heading into summer, along with fan favourites [85] **Kim Birrell** and [94] **Ajla Tomljanovic**.

"We could see multiple Aussies seeded in singles this year, which is a huge boost. The Demon is leading the charge, but there's real depth coming through and we know the fans will come out in force to cheer the Aussies on.

"AO 2026 is shaping up to be one of the most competitive and compelling in recent memory. With rivalries heating up, legends of the game chasing records, and fresh talent breaking through, fans can expect world-class tennis and more unforgettable moments at Melbourne Park this summer," Tiley continued.

More fun at AO Opening Week in 2026 - whole precinct open and kids go free day one

Opening Week at Australian Open 2026 will be bigger and better than ever before, with the entire precinct open for the first time from day one on Monday 12 January.

"Opening Week has continued to grow each year and I can't wait to see the whole site jumping from day one – Monday 12 January – and fans can enjoy the full AO experience from just \$10 for adults and \$5 for kids," Australian Open Tournament Director **Craig Tiley** said.

"We want the AO to be as accessible and family friendly as possible, which is why we're making day one of Opening Week free for all kids. We're also introducing an affordable family Ground Pass for two adults and two kids.

"From the family-favourite **AO Ballpark presented by Emirates** to **TOPCOURT** which is back by popular demand after its debut in 2025, plus all of the AO's incredible food and beverage offerings, fans will be able to discover everything the AO has to offer from day one of Opening Week."

In addition to the incredible tennis on display during AO qualifying where 256 men and women battle it out for a spot in the main draw, daily open practice is back, allowing fans to watch their favourite players up close from the front row of Rod Laver Arena.

There will be more opportunities for fans to interact with players in the **Practice Village** and on **Grand Slam Oval**, where top players will hand out **5000 Hot Shots Tennis** racquets over the course of Opening Week.

The game's biggest stars will again take centre stage in four nights of star-studded charity events in **Rod Laver Arena** as well as on **Kids Tennis Day presented by Emirates** on Saturday 17 January.

"The team has been busy creating more incredible activations and memorable experiences including live music every night on **Grand Slam Oval**.

"We are very excited to launch the new **Million Dollar 1 Point Slam**, with the ultimate winner – whether amateur or pro player - walking away with \$1 million in prize money. In the coming weeks we'll open entries at clubs around the country, and during Opening Week the finalists will battle it out for a spot to face the pros on Rod Laver Arena on Wednesday night – so you now have one million reasons to pick up a racquet and get in shape for January," Tiley said.

The inaugural 1 Point Slam at AO 2025 featured 16 amateur Victorian tennis players taking on 16 pros for the chance to win \$60,000. Victorian pro **Omar Jasika** took out the prize in front of an enthusiastic crowd in **Kia Arena**.

For the first time, Grand Slam Oval will feature live music every night of Opening Week, cementing its status as the AO's summer festival playground.

Australian Open 2026 will take the fan experience to new heights with the debut of two-storey structures in the precinct, expanded shaded seating, innovative food and drink options and the return of fan-favourite **TOPCOURT**.

"Every year more fans join in the festival of tennis and entertainment, and for AO 2026, we're taking the experience to the next level. From enhanced ways to view world-class tennis, to a range of gastronomic delights, we're creating new spaces that invite fans to immerse themselves like never before.

"At AO 2026, we're going up, we're raising the bar and introducing more upper-level, two-storey structures across the precinct. The Australian Open has announced The Kid LAROI, Peggy Gou, Spacey Jane, The Veronicas and Sofi Tukker will all headline AO LIVE Presents at AO 2026, with more acts to be announced.

AO LIVE Presents will expand to five nights of concerts in **John Cain Arena** at AO 2026, up from three nights this year.

"After the huge success of AO LIVE Presents this year – with three incredible sold-out shows – we're taking it to the next level in 2026, with five nights of headline acts in John Cain Arena to close out the AO," AO Entertainment Experience Producer **Gus Carmichael** said.

"From Wednesday 28 January to men's finals on Sunday 1 February, some of the world's biggest acts will take to the stage, including The Kid LAROI in an Australian exclusive, Peggy Gou, Spacey Jane and The Veronicas, with more names to be revealed soon.

"AO 2026 will be Melbourne's 21-day summer music festival, with a packed schedule of live music everyday across the precinct, and more special events to be announced over the coming weeks.

"For the first time, **Grand Slam Oval** will feature live music every night of **Opening Week**, cementing its status as the AO's summer festival playground. Adult Ground Passes start from just \$10 during Opening Week, presenting incredible value to fans."

Kicking things off in John Cain Arena on Wednesday 28 January is Australian rapper and singer **The Kid LAROI** in an exclusive Australian show. Rising from Sydney's hip-hop scene to global stardom, he has collaborated with artists including Justin Bieber and Juice WRLD, with his chart-topping hit *Stay* spending six weeks at No.1 on the Billboard Hot 100. With a No.1 debut project and millions of fans worldwide, LAROI is one of the most exciting young artists of his generation.

Spacey Jane will take the stage on Thursday 29 January. Since forming in Perth in 2016, the indie-rock quartet have become one of Australia's most loved bands, with two critically acclaimed albums, multiple sold-out tours and festival appearances from Splendour in the Grass to Reading & Leeds. Their breakout hit *Booster Seat* won ARIA Song of the Year and reached #2 in triple j's Hottest 100, while their 2022 follow-up album *Here Comes Everybody* debuted at No.1 on the ARIA Charts. With their third album *If That Makes Sense* released earlier this year, Spacey Jane are set to deliver their biggest and boldest sound yet to AO fans.

Much loved Australian band **The Veronicas** will perform in the evening on AO Pride Day on Friday 30 January. Since 2005, sisters **Lisa** and **Jessica Origliasso** have never been far from the top of the charts. Their smash hit Untouched was voted No.3 in the recent Triple J Hottest 100 Australian songs of all time. They will be joined by Grammy-nominated electronic duo **Sofi Tukker**, festival favorites known for their high energy live shows.

Closing out the AO is Korean-born DJ, producer and cultural icon **Peggy Gou** who will light up the stage on Sunday 1 February. From underground sensation to global star, Gou has become one of dance music's most recognisable names, with international hits including *It Makes You Forget (Itgehane)*, *Starry Night* and her 2023 smash *It Goes Like (Nanana)*. Having played the world's biggest clubs and festivals, Gou's infectious blend of house and techno is set to electrify AO fans.

Tickets for AO LIVE Presents start from \$99 which also includes Ground Pass access for the whole day, presenting great value for fans.

AO LIVE will feature music and entertainment across the precinct in 2026, including laidback acoustic acts in **Garden Square** and some of Melbourne's most in-demand DJs on Grand Slam Oval each day.

AO LIVE has been programmed by **Untitled Group**, Australia's largest independent music and events promoter.
