The event aims at providing a secondary schools competition for school sport association champion schools to come together to play each other for the national schools' championships.

In 2007 School Sport Australia took over the organisation of the event however due to constitutional changes in 2017 meant that Tennis Australia has taken back the running of the event.



Australian Schools Tennis Challenge Rules and Guidelines

These rules and guidelines are to be read in conjunction with Tennis Australia Policies, Procedures and Guidelines.

Please Note: Unless otherwise stated the International Tennis Federation (ITF) rules shall apply.

Section A – Rules of Eligibility

1. Eligibility

Team members must be enrolled as full-time students and be born in 2001 or later. This is to be verified by the Principal of the school.

Birth year brings competition into alignment with the International Schoolsports Federation (ISF) tennis competition age requirement.

2. Team Documentation

Refer to School Sport Australia Policy.

3. Match Rules / Conditions of Play

3.1 Team Eligibility

- 3.1.1** Each representative team shall have a maximum of six (6) players
- 3.1.2** Players are to be ranked in order of singles ability 1-6
- 3.1.3** Ranking of players for singles matches are to be tabled during the Managers Opening Meeting
- 3.1.4** The singles rankings are to remain the same for the duration of the competition. Doubles rankings and/or pairings may be altered from tie to tie but must be nominated before the commencement of each tie. If the No 1 and No 2 singles players are paired together for doubles then this pair must play in the No 1 doubles position.
- 3.1.5** Six (6) players only may be used in any Tie, singles and/or doubles, at the coach's discretion.

- 3.1.6** If only four (4) player have been named on the team sheet, the unnamed player can be used in one of the final two doubles if the result of the Tie has been determined (or in case of injury).

3.2 Match Format

- 3.2.1** The same type of draw is to be used for boys and girls.
- 3.2.2** Subject to court availability, only 2 singles ties are to be scheduled at one time.
- 3.2.3** Singles rubbers are the best of two sets, traditional tie break at 6 games all. At one set all, a match tie break (first to 10 points) to be played for the third set.

Doubles rubbers will be the best of two short sets (first to 4 games), with no-ad scoring (play one game point at deuce) and a traditional tie break at 4 games all.

3.3 National Disciplinary Policy

With the inclusion of these rules, all matches will be conducted in accordance with the Tennis Australia's Code of Behaviour policy.

3.4 Ranking of Players

At the commencement of the event, the players for each team will be ranked by their School Team Manager. This ranking shall be maintained throughout the event, replacements shall occupy the last position, with the other players moving up accordingly.

3.5 Forfeit

- 3.5.1** In the event of a forfeit in a match due to illness or injury, that player may be substituted for a remaining match.
- 3.5.2** In the event of a forfeit in a rubber due to illness or injury, the score that has been reached in the rubber stands and is recorded on the result sheet as same. (E.g. 5-3 set = 6-3; 6-0). The injured player automatically loses the rubber.

3.5.3 All ties must commence at the specified time given as per program/referee's discretion. If a team does not have a player/s ready to commence a rubber after 15 minutes has elapsed from the commencement time, the offending team will forfeit the rubber.

If after another 15 minutes has elapsed from the commencement time (i.e. 30 minutes in total), the offending team will forfeit the entire tie.

3.6 Determining a tie winner

Ties will be decided firstly in favour of the team winning the most rubbers. In the situation where the rubbers are equal, then the following rules will apply:

- If rubbers are even, then the team winning the greater number of sets will win the tie.
- If sets are even, the team winning the greater number of games will win the tie.

In the unlikely event that rubbers, sets and games are equal then the winner of the tie shall be the team that won the doubles rubber in which the No.1 singles players competed.

3.7 Point Scoring System

Final placings after the round robin are to be based on the following:

1. Number of Ties Won
2. Number of Rubbers Won
3. Number of Sets Won
4. Number of Games Won
5. Head-to-Head result
6. If no head-to-head result is available, each team will select a doubles pair (any pairing) to play a match tie break (first to 10 points) to decide the result.

3.8 Postponement of Play

If ties are postponed due to inclement weather, those ties will be completed before the next round of ties commence. If inclement weather prevails, the final decision for play will be made by the Referee and ASTC Coordinator.

3.9 Officials

3.9.1 Continuity of Play

A nominated team manager may elect to sit inside the court during play but may only give instructions to his/her player/s at the change of ends (i.e. within the specified time limit of 90 seconds). The nominated person must be registered on the team card at the commencement of the tie.

3.9.2 Disputes

Complaints concerning infringements of rules must be made to the Referee who will decide if an infringement has occurred and act accordingly.

3.10 Uniforms

Identifiable team uniforms are encouraged.
