




Playing tennis

Learning Objectives

- Be introduced to a mini doubles competition where they understand the rules and scoring system.
- Demonstrate tactical skills in a game situation.



- 1. Pair children up in doubles partners and give them three minutes to warm up together.
- 2. Provide children a further two minutes to get their longest rally of forehands and backhands. This will allow you to see improvement in consistency. Record the results to track improvement.
- 3. Explain the following rules of the Orange Coloured Ball Challenge.
 - Stand behind the baseline of the orange courts to serve.
 - Children need to attempt an overhead serve, but can perform their second serve underarm if necessary.
 - Children have two serves each and alternate serving sides.

Scoring option one

Children play a match tie-breaker which is first to 10 points with a margin of two points eg. 10-8 or 11-9.

The player whose turn it is to serve the first point of the match tie-break from the deuce court. The following two points shall be served by the opponent beginning from the Ad court. After this each player shall serve (beginning from the Ad court) alternating for two consecutive points until the end of the match tie-break.

Scoring option two

Time the games for five minutes each. This is often easier to control the amount of matches in a lesson. After five minutes children stop playing and provide you with their score.

Children should shake hands at the end of each game, leave the balls on the court and provide the deliverer with the results.

Using the round robin format, send the first matches to the courts. Continue through the round robin until all the games are finished.

While children are playing, note down one thing from each player that impressed you. i.e. calling out 'in' and 'out' with a clear voice for the opponent. At the end of the session highlight these to all children.

Use time throughout the session to give useful feedback to improve future performances.

Debrief/questions to ask

What was the hardest part of playing doubles?

Call children in and congratulate them on their play.

Run through all the positive notes you wrote down.
