## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year has seen the club and its members go through some significant changes, most notably the clubhouse renewal project and all new court lighting system. At the time writing, the clubhouse renovation has only just been completed and I'm sure members will all be pleasantly surprised and extremely pleased at the extent of work and improvement the clubhouse has undergone. We must sincerely thank Council for their work on this project, as it has been through their professional and management skills, and the hard work and dedication of several of our key committee members that have been able to achieve the completed project incorporating virtually all of our 'wish-list' ideas. From the club's point of view, I must personally thank Nadine Maloney, Sue Chambers and Peter Robinson for their efforts in seeing this project through; and I thank the members for coping well with the inconvenience of temporary facilities and arrangements. Finally, I wish to thank the MCC Bowling Club for generously allowing our members to use their (lovely) club for after competition and meeting purposes while our clubhouse was unavailable.

The other major changes have been the all new court lighting system and several new areas of court fencing. The new fencing has been arranged in co-ordination with Council, however the new lights were somewhat forced upon us when one of the light poles suddenly collapsed in strong winds! Fortunately no one was on court or injured (even though your President was about to open the gates to that court for Sunday social) and it was assessed that all light poles were of an age and condition that required replacement for safety requirements. Even though once again Council was able to assist with this project, the bulk of the financial commitment was borne by the club and thanks to our healthy finances, the club was able to fund the works without resorting to external borrowings or any additional call on members. We did find some members offered to assist financially if required, and we sincerely thank those members for their kind gesture.

Members may also note that pole padding was recently installed on all light poles, and this has been due to the club generously receiving a grant to do so. We must thank the Rotary Club of Balwyn and City of Boroondara for allocating this grant to the club.

This year sees more changes on committee, with several long standing members deciding to retire, providing an opportunity for others to bring a fresh perspective to the club. There is no longer a standing member than Wilma Anderson - our club 'matriarch'. Wilma has finally decided that she is entitled to have a rest from committee after serving as a committee member, including mid-week representative, for a staggering 52 years! In any circumstances that is a remarkable achievement and throughout the time we have only ever known Wilma to show grace and poise in anything she did. Wilma certainly added an air of decorum during committee meetings. On behalf of the club, I extend my sincerest thanks to Wilma for all you have done for the club and hope you have a well-deserved rest. David Neyland and Peter Robinson have also decided to step down from their roles, both providing tremendous services to the club. David Neyland has served in the role of Treasurer for 10 years and the club has greatly benefited from his dedication and enthusiasm for the role, and his greater club commitments. His tremendous work and tireless efforts in compiling the club's centenary history must rank as one of the greatest personal achievements of his time at the club, and we thank you for all your efforts.

Similarly, Peter Robinson has also shown great dedication and energy in his various roles for the club, having served on the committee for many years. His performance in his role as Vice President over the last 12 months has been invaluable to the club, and particularly to myself, as without his initiative and efforts, many of the projects and achievements the club has benefited from over the last year would not have been accomplished. ## **SELECTION AND COMPETITION**

Similar to previous years, senior competition participation and the standard of competition play continue to be a key focus for the club.

Hawthorn had 6 teams submitted in the 2013/2014 Bayside Region Summer Competition. This represented 2 more teams than the previous year and meant that Hawthorn's courts were being fully utilised over the summer season (in fact over-utilised, with additional courts needing to be hired from time to time). This is something we haven't achieved for some time. 4 out of these 6 teams made the finals, which is an excellent result, particularly given the Committee had made a concerted effort this year on trying to ensure teams would be competitive in their respective grades – not always an easy task given much of the decision making on grade selection is out of our hands.

Winter 2014 saw 6 competition teams, with a Bayside Competition Mixed team and 4 Tennis Victoria Pennant teams submitted.

Given the disappointment of not having any Women's Pennant teams in the past few years, the HTC Selection Committee gave itself the challenge of breaking this pattern in 2014. Pleasingly, we were able to enter a Grade 2 Women's team in this year's competition. Even more pleasing was that this newly formed team was also very competitive, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> on the Sectional ladder and making it through to the finals (although not successful in taking out the Grade 2 flag..... give them time!).

The HTC Men's pennant teams had a reasonable year in 2014, with 1 team (Grade 7) finishing on top of their Sectional ladder and making the finals cut, and 2 teams narrowly missing out on the finals rounds (Men's Open Doubles Grade 3 and Men's Masters 50+ Grade B). On the whole, it was good to see that nearly all teams were competitive in the section they were competing in.

Disappointingly however, is visible erosion in our higher grade Men's competition teams. Our highest team in 2014 was Grade 7 (last year it was Grade 4). This has been due to a variety of reasons and circumstances (longer term club members moving interstate, illness, family priorities etc). The Selection and Competition committee will be focusing on putting effort in to reversing this trend – hopefully we will see some inroads made, as we have seen with the Club's Women's competition, for next pennant season.

For the upcoming 2014/2015 Bayside competition (BRTA), commencing early October 2014, it is encouraging to see that we have been able to enter 6 teams again this year – once again, a full house for Saturday afternoons. This year we will have 4 x Mixed teams (Sections A, 3, 4, 5), 1 x Men's singles/doubles (Section 5), and a newly formed Ladies' singles/doubles team in Section 1.

The Club wishes to once again thank all Club competition players, and an extra big thank-you to all competition team captains, for their efforts throughout the year.

A special thank you also needs to be made to the MCC Bowling Club, for their generosity and hospitality in allowing the HTC competition teams to use the MCC facilities for afternoon tea during the period that the clubhouse was unavailable due to the refurbishment works.

Looking forward to a smashing year of competition, and enhanced competition viewing from the new clubhouse deck should very much add to the enjoyment!

## **COACHING**

I would like to firstly thank the Committee of the Hawthorn Tennis Club for their continued support over the past 12 months. The Committee is the backbone of every club and this is evident amongst the very dedicated group of people working in the best interests of their members.

Secondly, thank you to my dedicated staff that consistently support the coaching program and nurture the pupils and ladies in tennis: Denys Parmentier, George Vogiatzis, Alex Ahern, Anthony Luppino and Vanessa Luu. Their loyalty and devotion has been commendable and much appreciated.

The coaching program has continued to be very successful over the past 12 months. Coaching is conducted Monday–Friday after school/evenings. Including Groups, Squads and Private Lessons. On Saturday and Sunday morning private lessons are conducted.

The Ladies coaching program continues on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings and Friday afternoon as well as a ladies group on Tuesday evening.

Tennis Victoria has once again granted Hawthorn Tennis Club the opportunity to host the 'Mum's in Tennis 5 week program' during term 4 2014. This fantastic initiative is supported by Tennis Victoria. The 5-week program will commence during mid-October. I am anticipating this program to be a great success, with the introduction of more ladies and families to the club. In addition to this a 4yr old tennis coaching program will be conducted as well as a child minding service will be offered to ensure all ladies can participate in the program!

Coaching for children has continued to follow a structured program according to their age. Including the 5 to 7 year olds with the emphasis being on learning basic skills, fun and movement, while correct technique, stroke combination and running drills are implemented for the older children. The squads continue to be extremely popular amongst the juniors who play competition (juniors and seniors). The emphasis is on consistency and game building, while ensuring correct etiquette during both coaching and competition.

The entire coaching program is designed to ensure all participants obtain the maximum benefit from their involvement. The coaching program is very fortunate to have its dedicated and highly qualified coaches to ensure the clients are nurtured in coaching at Hawthorn, as it is a real challenge to find appropriate staff in the industry of tennis coaching. All coaching staff have an excellent rapport with both the children and parents, and I receive constant positive feedback from all concerned.

Advertising at the local schools has proven to be a great success, however now the word of mouth is proving to be the best form of advertising. Many clients are talking about how well structured and organised the program is at hawthorn which in response is drawing in clientele.

October 2014 a pamphlet distribution to 5 local primary schools as well as a letterbox drop of 3,000 pamphlets to the surrounding homes will promote what is being offered in coaching at the Hawthorn Tennis Club.

Sadly Denys has had to go back to Italy. He has loved his time coaching in Hawthorn and has formed very strong relationships with all clients - children / ladies / parents. Thank you to him for all his efforts.

I look forward to introducing and welcoming a new staff member Michael Davey. Michael has had 10 years coaching experience working in exclusive clubs / academies in Brisbane before moving recently to Melbourne to continue his coaching career. He has had experience in a various range of coaching from beginner to high performance, conducting junior groups and ladies groups, squads and private lessons. Michael has also played at a high level in both juniors and seniors. Playing future and Satellite tournaments on the circuit. He will be commencing coaching during the first week of term 4.

McDonald's Hawthorn and Prince have continued to be generous sponsors throughout the year in providing encouragement and incentives to the children in the coaching program and their support has been much appreciated.

For the future, my plans are to continue building the coaching / membership base, ensuring more players are joining for junior and senior competitions and form some mid-week ladies teams in the future.

## WORKS AND MAINTENANCE

There have been a number of works completed this year.

A big windstorm in September 2013 blew most of the red porous off the courts. Thanks to the volunteers who helped scrap back the courts and spread 40 bags of porous to get the courts back to a playable condition.

Supervision of the installation of new lighting was undertaken in January 2014. Courts were repaired where necessary after the lighting works were completed.

The construction of new fencing around courts 1 to 3 was completed in June 2014. The City of Boroondara replaced the southern fence which was damaged during the Hawthorn Precinct Project. The council also replaced the eastern fence which was an unexpected bonus. I would like to thank the council for their assistance. Court repair was undertaken after the works where necessary.

Light pole padding was purchased in August 2014. The club was successful in applying for a Boroondara Community Development Grant of \$1,500 which provided funding for three quarters of the cost of the padding. I would like to thank the City of Boroondara and the Rotary Club of Balwyn for providing their support to community projects.

The cost of the new lighting meant we had to cut down on expenditure and rely on volunteers to keep the club and courts shipshape. Gardening, minor plumbing works, line repairs, court repair, weed spraying, clearing balls off the roof, minor electrical work and sprinkler repairs were all completed by volunteers. About 90 bags of porous were used during the year for court repair.

I would especially like to thank Andrew Simpson, Peter Don, Sue Chambers and Robert Tuck for their assistance during the year.

The club will be looking for a new cleaner as Elaine Leplaa has retired after many years of fine service to the club. Thanks Elaine for doing such a great job keeping the club house and surrounds spic and span.

## **MEMBERSHIP**

Membership numbers have decreased by 15 this year. Our membership does fluctuate from year to year but our numbers are trending downwards. This year we had 159 renewals and 47 new members. Two families comprising 9 members did not renew because of lack of use of our facilities and moving overseas. We also had another 6 members moving interstate, overseas or away from the Hawthorn area. Some of our junior members have lost interest in the sport. Other non -renewing members did not provide any feedback on their decision to leave the club.
