



Mudgee District Tennis Club – Child Safety Information Sheet

- While MDTC strives to provide a safe and child-friendly facility, all children on MDTC premises must be supervised by a responsible adult (parent or guardian) at all times.
- Please take note of the child-safety signs on display at the Clubhouse.
- All children playing in competitions, receiving lessons or engaged in holiday camps must be current members prior to play.
- All members must comply with Tennis Australia's Member Protection Policy and Code of Behaviour. Copies are available at the Clubhouse or on the website <http://www.tennis.com.au/mudgee>
- All MDTC contractors, volunteers and staff that interact with children are required to have valid Working with Children Checks.
- If a child is involved in an incident, an Incident Report Form must be completed. Copies are available in the Clubhouse or on the website <http://www.tennis.com.au/mudgee>
- A first-aid kit is available in the kitchen at the Clubhouse.
- By permitting your child to play tennis, undertake tennis-related activities and/or undertake tennis coaching at MDTC, you acknowledge that such activities are inherently physical and can be dangerous and that any child or person who participates in them is at risk of injury and to the full extent permitted by law, you release and hold harmless MDTC and their respective directors, officers, employees, contractors, volunteers and agents from any injury, loss or damage your child may suffer arising out of or in relation to your child's participation in such activities and you also release and indemnify MDTC and their respective directors, officers, employees, volunteers, contractors and agents from any actions proceedings claims demands expenses damages and liabilities howsoever arising or incurred as a result of or in connection with your child's participation in such activities.
- MDTC take no responsibility for any loss of or damage to personal property that occurs on MDTC's premises.
