The Museum deals with several enquires every week, often carried out by our honorary librarian, volunteer Bruce Ryan. The queries often require some lateral thinking or extensive research, and occasionally we cannot answer the specifics but can point people in the right direction to get the answer they seek. In the last months we have tried to solve questions such as of the first known photograph of a social game of tennis in Australia, solve the mystery of an unknown tennis player and answer the query of the percentage of players who retire from competition tennis due to injury or forfeits! Incredibly, Bruce was able to answer the latter after a search of the internet and the discovery of a research paper on that very subject!
