Tennis NT was established in 1980 under the incorporated name of the Northern Territory Tennis Council. The organisation changed its incorporated identity in 2005 to Tennis NT Incorporated and trades simply as Tennis NT. Its establishment was the shared vision of the founding President, Mr Max Horton OAM and a small group of interested tennis players. Their vision foresaw the need for a 'parent body' to assume a role of guidance along with the benefits of establishing relationships with the Northern Territory Government and Tennis Australia.

President Report





Newk, Sam and Warren at the Newcombe Medal, Australian Tennis Awards.

John Newcombe was a rugged serve-volleyer and a great competitor. His most formidable weapons – serve, volley and forehand – were used to devastating effect. "Newk" captured seven Grand Slam singles titles, winning all but the French. Newcombe and Tony Roche won 12 Grand Slam doubles titles together – more than any other Australian men's team in tennis history. Newcombe would eventually own 17 doubles majors by the end of his career. He was part of five winning Davis Cup teams, four successive victories between 1964 and 1967 and the all-star pro team of 1973. In 1994 Newcombe was named Davis Cup captain and led Australia to a 3-2 win over France in the 1999 final.¹

"Shakespeare on Management" Paul Corrigan takes a fascinating look at the psychology of leadership using classic Shakespearean characters. He shows how, through his plays, Shakespeare demonstrates the different roles a leader can take and the different skills needed. He analyses the decisionmaking and actions of certain characters to see what can be learnt by today s managers, such as: * How Richard II's belief that having the title of King was enough became fatal; * Why Richard III's manipulative approach finally isolated him; * What made Henry V a great leader? * How Shakespeare's development of subplots directs our attention to the vital role of support staff; * What can we learn from Lear's fool about how to advise for leaders. Play after play taught 16th-century audiences lessons about how leaders organized their rise to power and how their failures precipitated their decline. In the 21st century we need to learn a great deal about how to lead and there is much that still can be learnt about leadership, power and responsibility from Shakespeare's magnificent works.2

The measure of any organisation is how well it stacks up against its stated aims and objectives.

Notwithstanding, it is the team that pulls you through.

2012/2013 saw Tennis NT spring from the gates and hit the ground running hard. Leading from the front, General Di MacDonald had a strong start to the season building on a very successful 11/12. The backup team Pat Coburn, Mark Pead and Jamie Stefanato were in hot pursuit.

In April 2013 the bomb hit. It saddened us all to see Di MacDonald depart Tennis NT. Di and I had worked closely together for over five years, me the 'newby' President and she the experienced CEO. Di was dedicated to the end and a fierce advocate for Tennis in the Territory. Notwithstanding her pay cheque coming from Tennis Australia Di would not take a backward step if she felt 'Head Office' was off in the wrong direction. Di is a wonderful administrator and manager and we all miss her enormously.

Welcome Sam Gibson! Sam has taken on the role as General Manager Tennis NT. He is leading a slightly revised team with Community Tennis Officer Erin Bormann joining following Jamie Stefanato's departure.

What games, sets and matches did we win this year? By the end of 2013 registered players had grown by 34.2% over the number registered in 2012. Our tournament numbers also increased over this period by a very pleasing 18.8%. The trend was across the court with most tournaments registering increased numbers.

Coaching numbers were up notwithstanding a slight drop in activations with total coaching participants growing by 12.8%. Community tennis participants also increased with an overall increase of 20.3%, again despite a slight drop in activations. The drop off in activations can be explained by the recruitment lag following the departure of Jamie Stefanato to Tennis Vic.

In August last year we witnessed the baton changing hands in the Wedding Cake with 'Territory' Mills taking on the Chief's role. He said at the time "We will bring the Territory together again, no division, no Berrimah line, we're all in this together." Unfortunately, as both Julia Gillard and Kevin Rudd know life is not safe at the top of a political party.

In 13/14 our focus will remain strong by building relationships with government at all levels.

Manager Report



Since assuming the role with Tennis NT in April 2013 three of the strongest impressions I have immediately received relate to the passion of the people within the tennis community, the strong commitment of coaches, players and volunteers and the healthy state of tennis throughout the entire Territory. It is also these three things that have tennis well placed moving into the future.

T-16, Tennis' Strategy for the NT, focusses on the broad areas of Participation and Performance. As such, it is pleasing to note a 34% increase in registered participants for the year ending 31 December 2012. This result comes off the back of significant increases in participation in Community Tennis Activations and is a testament to the hard work of Tennis NT staff Jamie Stefanato and Erin Bormann, and Member Affiliates who have tirelessly driven participation in tennis through outstanding programs such as Tennis in Schools, MLC Tennis Hot Shots and Cardio Tennis. In tune with this success was the continued achievements of the Gove Peninsula Tennis Club who were once again named finalists for both the Most Outstanding Tennis Community and Most Outstanding Club categories at the 2012 Newcombe Medal, Australian Tennis Awards. This ongoing recognition is an outstanding feat which is acknowledged throughout Australia.

Despite the loss of a combined Pro Tour tournament in Darwin and the women's event in Alice Springs, we witnessed an increased number of competitors taking part in the wide range of sanctioned tournaments held across the Territory. This increase was particularly evident in Junior Tour Tournaments and the Medibank Junior Development Series. Tournaments play a key role in T-16 and our ultimate goal of having a National Champion, as such the work by our Member Affiliates, officials and the leadership and expertise provided by Mark Pead cannot be underestimated.

A key driver behind tennis' participation and performance goals is the recruitment and development of quality coaches and the subsequent support to enhance coach capacity to achieve positive outcomes. Pat Coburn has undertaken a considerable amount of work in both recruiting new coaches through the delivery of coach education and developing coaches using various platforms of professional development. As such, tennis in the NT has found itself in a very strong position which I know can be capitalised upon in the years to come.

While it is the intention of Tennis NT to support the growth of tennis in the NT, it is clear that this wouldn't be possible without the support we receive from a number of stakeholders. Firstly I would like to thank Tennis Australia for the support readily provided across all of our key business areas. Their considerable investment in tennis at all levels has certainly enabled Tennis NT to proactively seek growth. The NT Government must also be recognised for their support and investment in tennis right across the NT. I'd also like to acknowledge our various sponsors who are critical in the running of various tournaments and programs.

Finally I would like to recognise the significant work of the entire NT tennis community whose countless hours and passion hold the sport in good stead, the Tennis NT Board in their commitment to advancing the sport and the support and hard work of the talented and devoted Tennis NT team.

As we continue on our journey outlined by T-16 it is important to take a step back and consider the environment in which tennis takes place and the next steps that need to take place in order to continue tennis' success. Moving forward the relationships we form and the strong networks throughout the sport will be the foundations for our success. Therefore, I look forwards to working with the NT tennis community in achieving the results we all desire.

Tennis Australia CEO Report



Northern Territory has been a pivotal contributor in driving our sport toward its ongoing and over-arching goal of having more and more people play tennis.

One of the biggest pillars in that strategy has been our MLC Hot Shots program which has been a success throughout the Territory. Full credit must go to the Tennis NT staff and clubs for their hard work and dedication to a program that is effectively delivering the future of our sport. Nationally we had more than 600,000 children pick up a racquet in the last 12 months.

Among the adults one of the growing success stories is Cardio Tennis which attracted more than 17,000 registrants during 2012-2013. Attracting and retaining both children and adults into the sport as well as replenishing the national court inventory are two of the platforms that will ensure the long-term health of the sport. Therefore the other critical achievement was the 283 new or reconditioned courts completed in the last 12 months, as part of the national Court Rebate Scheme.

Tennis Australia has continued to pursue strong revenue opportunities to help fund these infrastructure and participation growth strategies. Our biggest opportunities in revenue are around our summer of events and we now host more than one million attendees at these events nationally. Together with this, we have future-proofed our business loading it with capability to take on the 21st Century frontiers that are media and broadcast content and Asia. We have configured our entire organization to tackle the ongoing societal challenges and barriers around participation in tennis and the never-ending challenges of developing elite players.

On a personal note, I would like to thank all of those involved in our fantastic sport throughout Northern Territory for their incredible dedication and terrific support of not only tennis, but also of me in my role as the CEO. I have decided to resign and pursue other interests and will leave the organisation on 30 September. But I do so full of pride not only in our collective body of work, but in the terrific people who have shown their great talent and capacity to advocate for our sport. Their actions have helped tennis enormously and in turn have been of great benefit to the community in which we all live.





Tennis Australia's Community Tennis Officer Program

Tennis Australia's "Community Tennis Officer" program has continued to produce excellent results in the Northern Territory. With this resource tennis is able to drive promotional activities and create the necessary relationships to achieve stability and sustain growth.

5,767 individuals participated in Community Tennis programs which reflect a 20.32% increase over the 2011-12 figures. These programs included: Tennis in Schools; Cardio Tennis; Indigenous Tennis; Disabilities Tennis and Community Activations.

Tennis NT acknowledges the significant investment made by Tennis Australia to this very important element of promoting our sport and the support received from our Member Affiliates and coaches.

Player Registration



Power and Water Regional Development Program



Tennis continues its very successful partnership with Power and Water which has provided substantial investment into regional tennis development outside of the metropolitan area. This partnership is gratefully acknowledged. The 2012-13 reporting period recognises the second year of a three year term.

The partnership is managed by identified program objectives.

At the beginning of 2012-13 both the Northern (Tennis Gove – Nicky Mayer) and Southern (Tennis Alice Springs – Matt Roberts) Memorandum of Understandings (MOU) were renegotiated with the respective Regional Development Officers.

The success of both these partnerships can be seen on Page 14 of this report in which 13.06% increase in participation was witnessed in the Northern Region, along with a 77.12% increase in the Southern Region. This is extraordinary work by both Nicky and Matt.



Tennis NT look forward to seeing the continued growth in these areas as Nicky and Matt continue their work visiting new communities to deliver the MLC Tennis Hot Shots program. With the transient nature of the Territory, the aim is now to train up local community members to deliver the program, in the hope that this will provide more stability for the sport in these communities.



In an endeavour to keep Katherine engaged in the Regional Development Program, Tennis NT has continued to visit the club to run training sessions with both their amazing volunteer coaches and with their school sport teams. It is hoped, in the coming year, Katherine will once again have a qualified coach to uphold the fantastic work the volunteers have done to keep the club and coaching sessions running.

INPEX Centre Managers Workshop

The annual two day Workshop is convened to provide a forum specifically for Northern Territory tennis centre managers. Thirteen participants gathered to network and share 'best practice' in early March 2013.





The primary theme of the INPEX Centre Managers Workshop was to define priorities and determine program structures for the next four year cycle. In line with T 16 the Workshop had a particular focus on both participation and performance.

Of particular note were the discussions around participation initiatives such as Tennis in Schools, MLC Tennis Hot Shots and Coach Education, as well as performance based programs including Tournament Planning, Project Talent and Player Development tools. The results of these discussions form the basis for Tennis NT in pursuing outcomes for tennis in the Territory.

The contributions of the various attendees are a crucial element in Tennis NT's desire to ensure a united approach to the delivery of tennis.







MLC Tennis Hot Shots

MLC Tennis Hot Shots (MLCTHS) is tennis especially for children. It incorporates smaller courts, smaller racquets and low-compression tennis balls that don't bounce too high. All of this makes learning tennis easy and best of all, fun. There are three stages – Red, Orange and Green – all of which help develop children's skills and confidence.

Across the Metropolitan Region the lunch time MLCTHS program continued to be great success. The program is greatly appreciated by the teachers and the students continue to enjoy and look forward to the opportunity to experience tennis at their school. One of the benefits of the program is that students, who may not get to play tennis, are able to experience the sport. The intention of this program is to connect students with tennis centres with the aim of having a smooth transition into club programs. Tennis NT's Community Tennis Officer facilitates the relationship and provides program expertise to ensure students receive quality tennis experiences.

MLCTHS also continues to be used as the community engagement program attached to major events such as the Pro Tour.

In 2012-13 there were nine registered MLCTHS deliverers in the Northern Territory providing programs for 666 participants. The MLCTHS deliverers were:

Tennis in Schools

Tennis Australia's National Schools Partnership Program (NSPP) continued strongly this year, not only retaining its pilot schools, but gaining support from new schools.

With the continued support from Mathew Ryan (Nightcliff Primary School) and Adam Gulla (The Essington School Darwin) along with new partnerships forming with Jodie Austin (Nakara Primary School), Matthew Bramich (Gapuwiyak CEC), Steve Venour (Nhulunbuy Christian College), Jillian Neyland (OLSH: Traeger Campus) and Daryl Grahek (Casuarina St Primary), the Northern Territory showed a strong connection to schools throughout all its regions as part of the NSPP.

All schools that signed up to the program continued to receive an equipment pack and manual in order to aid them in running the sessions at their schools. 2013 also saw the introduction of the Playback Rebate, which was brought in to encourage schools to sign up as many of their students as possible to MLC Tennis Hot Shots. With every student the school signed up, they earned themselves \$2 to spend on new tennis equipment of their choice when they resigned with the NSPP in the 2013/14 financial year.

As part of the NSPPs ongoing professional development, two teachers were once again invited to attend the National Teachers Conference held at the Australian Open in January 2012. This year it was Jodie Austin from Nakara Primary School and Mathew Bramich from Gapuwiyak School that were lucky enough to be invited attend. They went, along with Mathew Ryan, who was invited down as a

guest speaker for the conference, to discuss the journey Nightcliff Primary School had been through.



Australian tennis legend and *MLC Tennis Hot Shots Tennis in Schools Ambassador* John Fitzgerald made the trip to Darwin in order to officially open the three new *MLC Tennis Hot Shots* courts that were laid at Nightcliff Primary School on Thursday 26 July 2012. These courts were the first of their kind to appear in a school throughout the whole of Australia. This national first was achieved through the dedication of Nightcliff Primary School, along with help from Tennis Australia's National Court Rebate Scheme.



2012 also saw the inaugural MLCTHS Inter-Schools Challenge Cup take place between Nightcliff Primary School and The Essington School Darwin, two highly active NSPP schools. This competition took place after school over five weeks from October 10 – November 7, 2012, with play being held at both school venues on red ball courts. Finals were then played at the partner club of both schools, DTC Sports, with Nightcliff Primary School bringing home the glory – and the trophy – for 2012.

Cardio Tennis





Cardio Tennis is a national initiative designed for people of all ages and abilities to participate in tennis in a fun, social, group tennis environment with a focus on fitness. It is more about getting a great, high-energy workout than pure tennis technique. The future growth of Cardio Tennis forms a key part of Tennis NT's strategic focus on participation.

In 2012-13 there were five registered Head Cardio Tennis coaches in the Northern Territory providing workouts for 115 participants. These coaches were:

Indigenous Tennis Program

Northern Region Development Officer Nicky Mayer, continues to exceed expectations with her passion and drive to promote tennis to Indigenous children as part of the *Power and Water* Regional Development Program. In 2012-13 Nicky made seven school visits to Indigenous Communities. The continued popularity of Nicky's visit has given her the drive to continue visiting a number of these communities. In turn Nicky has built strong relationships with the communities A permanent component of her visits includes up skilling community leaders in the delivery of tennis. Equipment is always left behind, providing the opportunity for these communities to continue playing tennis following this remarkable developmental work.

Learn Earn Legend! – Indigenous Come & Try Days – July 2012

The initiative known as the "Learn Earn Legend!" hit the Top End again in July 2012, starting with the official launch in Darwin on July 24 with Evonne Goolagong-Cawley appearing at the Danila Dilba

Health Service with some indigenous athletes. From there it was on to Palmerston on July 25 for a fantastic day of tennis fun, with indigenous students coming in from around the Darwin & Palmerston region to meet Evonne and also receive coaching from Ian Goolagong, the National Indigenous coach. Following this, Learn Earn Legend visited both Alice Springs and Gove on July 27 and July 30 respectively. As a follow on from this students that displayed enthusiasm and determination, amongst other attributes, were selected not only for scholarships, but also to attend national camps later in the year.





Combined State Indigenous Camp (SA, NT & WA) – November 2012

Five Northern Territory athletes were selected to represent the Territory at a combined state camp in Adelaide in November 2012. They were: *Eytahnyia Scott-Jones* and *Zachary Scott-Jones* from Gove, Serena Adams and Natalie Roe from Darwin and Kylan Bishop from Alice Springs.





Goolagong National Development Camp – January 2013

Five Northern Territory athletes were selected for the January Camp in 2013. They were: Kyle Hampton, Nathan Hawke, Stephanie Long, Natalie Roe and Tarlina Tipungwuti. The Camp is designed for talented indigenous youth, aged 10 to 21 years. The Camp was held in Melbourne during the first week of the Australian Open.

Tennis NT acknowledges Tennis Australia for their work in promoting Indigenous Tennis.

Disabilities Tennis Program

As part of the Regional Development Program, Tennis Gove's Nicky Mayer continued to work with the Nhulunbuy High School Special Education Annexe.

Eight participants completed the program, scheduled in Term 3, 2012.

Whilst Tennis NT does not conduct a dedicated Disabilities Program; work has been done through the Tennis in Schools program with Nemarluk School in Term 2, 2013 and future events are being planned for the second half of 2013 in conjunction with the Australian Paralympic Committee.



Athlete Development



Project Talent = High Performance Tennis for 12 and Under Players

Tennis Australia's Project Talent initiative was the driving force behind player development in the Territory during the reporting year. With a focus on 12 and under players and a philosophy of improving rather than replacing their club training environments Project Talent is an ideal fit for the Territories aspirational coaches and our remote geography. Tennis NT's Project Talent strategy includes:

Coaches

During the reporting year Matt Roberts (Tennis Alice Springs) joined Matt Dudley (AWOF Sports) as recognised Tennis Australia Talent Development Coaches.

All affiliated clubs running coaching programs were visited by Tennis NT's Coach and Talent Development Manager. During these visits a collaborative approach to coach and program development is discussed with Tennis NT being the service provider for individual coach professional development and support.

Capture

Territory coaches were recognised as having the 'eyes and intuition' to spot and develop talent. All athletes engaged in Project Talent Camps or the Video Analysis Program were identified by their club coaches as players of promise.

Camps

Territory athletes accessed five local Project Talent Camp's during the reporting year. This included Club based camps at Palmerston, Gove and at AWOF Sports and two Tennis NT camps in Darwin. Due to the timing of the Primary School Exchange the Alice Springs camp was cancelled. The planned camp at the Gardens tennis facility was postponed to the second half of the year. In total 67 athletes from across the Territory attended Project Talent Camps. Territory athletes were also able to access two interstate Project Talent Camps. .

AWOF Sports accepted Tennis NT invitation to participate in the Queensland Academy 12 and under Challenge. This involved AWOF Sports coach Matt Dudley taking a team of four players to Brisbane in April to compete against fifteen other Queensland Coaching Academies.



Athlete Development



In May *Peter Politis* (AWOF Sports) and *Thomas Van Haaren* (Tennis Alice Springs) participated in Tennis Australia's 10s National Project Talent Camp in Canberra.

Attending coaches included: Pat Coburn, Sam Giess, Nathan Ingram and *Matt Roberts pictured*.

Five Parent Information sessions covering Gove, Alice Springs, Palmerston and Darwin were held with topics ranging from Training and Tournament Scheduling, The Road Ahead, Compete and The Athlete Development Pathway. In all 49 parents attended these sessions.



Competitions

Super 10s commenced in the Territory with trials being held in the Metropolitan, Northern and Southern Regions to select players and their coaches to attend the Super 10s Project Talent Camp in September. From the camp four boys and four girls were selected to represent the NT in the Super 10s National Finals held at Melbourne Park during the second week of the Australian Open.

The boys' team finished 7th while the girls' team finished 6th.



National Academy Partnership

Tennis Australia continues to invest in Northern Territory player development through a formal Service Agreement with Tennis NT. The services captured in this Agreement are delivered by National Academy Manager SA, Rohan Fisher.

Rohan visited the Northern Territory twice this reporting period to work with players, consult with coaches and parents, and also provide services to identified players through the VAP (Video Analysis Program). This is an 'under-pinning' program for Territory players aspiring to play at a national level.

Tennis NT acknowledges the investment of Tennis Australia in this part of our business.

Athlete Development



Northern Territory Institute of Sport (NTIS)

The NTIS is the NT Government's Centre of Sporting Excellence for the identification, development and support of the Territory's talented athletes and coaches.

The aim of the NTIS is to develop Northern Territory athletes into champions. The NTIS has three Key Performance Indicators (KPIs):

- Improved NTIS athlete performance and achievements
- NTIS athletes representing Australia
- NTIS athletes competing in National leagues or professional competitions



In keeping with the NTIS objectives, the NTIS provides priority support to athletes, and their coaches, who demonstrate capacity to perform and achieve at the highest levels within their chosen sport.



The NT Government considers NTIS scholarships an investment in Territory sport, with the purpose of achieving NTIS KPIs. Therefore, the NT Government, through the NTIS, assumes primary program development and management authority for all supported programs.

To be recommended as an NTIS Scholarship holder tennis players must first meet specific performance criteria, and then be approved by Tennis NT's Selections Committee. NTIS tennis athletes who sit below National Academy Scholarship are responsible, with their private coaches, for the design and implementation of their individual training program.

In 2012-13 Michael Shepheard was Tennis NT's only NTIS athlete.

Video Analysis Program (VAP)

22 athletes were nominated by their coaches for VAP. This included thirteen Metropolitan Region athletes, two Northern Region athletes and seven Southern Region athletes. After the player was filmed a stakeholder meeting was held with the athlete, their parents, their private coach and representatives of Tennis NT. During the meeting discussions take place around the athletes training and tournament schedule, their video footage with agreed recommendations for future improvements and their developing game style and tactical focus.

Private coaches and athletes where left with a USBs containing stroke analysis and correction advice.

The program also provides an opportunity to develop the VAP athlete's private coach with a one-on-one professional development forum with the key stakeholders.



Professional Development Workshops

Three workshops were conducted for coaches, translating into 37 Professional Development experiences. Engagement with coaches is a key priority for Tennis NT moving forward. Tennis NT acknowledges the pivotal role coaches play within the tennis community, therefore diverse support is offered primarily through the Coach and Talent Development Manager Position.

Seven individual coach site visits were conducted where coaches were observed by Tennis NT's Coach and Talent Development Manager working in their regular coaching environments. The observation is followed by either a formal or informal feedback as requested by the coach. The intention of the site visits is to improve the coaches' service delivery. They are conducted at the request of the coaches with feedback being provided in whatever format the coach requests.

The Northern Territory continues to have great representation from its small tennis community and Tennis NT acknowledges these coaches for their personal commitment and their desire for knowledge.







Talent Development Coaches

Tennis Australia has continued to invest in this selected network of coaches who specialise in the development of athletes under the age of twelve. This group of coaches has additional professional development opportunities provided, with added benefits including travel grants.

Ultimately the purpose of this engagement is to build stronger relationships and partnerships with private coaches to improve the quality and quantity of athletes.

At the end of 2012-13 the Northern Territory had two Talent Development Coaches; AWOF Sports' Head Coach Matt Dudley and Tennis Alice Springs' Head Coach Matt Roberts. They join a network of 140 nationally recognised Talent Development Coaches.

Competitions



People's Choice Metro League



The winning team *pictured* for the 2012 *People's Choice Metro League* competition was decided in September with DTC Sports 2 claiming the champion's pennant. The competition included four teams, an increase of 100% from the previous reporting period, due largely to the new facility in Palmerston.

Each of the four teams submitted a six person team to compete in the Metro League with an additional four person team contesting the Reserve League. The rules enabled players to move between Leagues' if required.

People's Choice Credit Union partnered Tennis NT in the running of the Metro League; this support is invaluable and is acknowledged by Tennis NT.

People's Choice Metro League Midweek

Tennis NT conducted a seven week pilot modified competition in line with the *Asia Pacific Tennis League* (ATL) Rules and Regulations, after feedback from the 2012 *Metro League - Survey* that players were interested in more competitive opportunities. The pilot was conducted in the May – June period on Wednesday nights as a lead up to the 2013 Tournament season.

The Midweek competition was conducted at AWOF Sports, Gardens Tennis and Tennis Palmerston on a rotating roster with seven teams of two players each.

ALLIED PICKFORDS Senior Points Circuit

The ALLIED PICKFORDS Senior Points Circuit (SPC) comprises six tournaments conducted across the Northern Territory. This circuit provides individuals with the opportunity to compete for SPC points as well as a cash bonus of \$500 for the winning Man (sponsored by Darwin Financial Services) and winning Woman (sponsored by KR Blacker & Associates) at the end of the circuit. Events Calendar

The Northern Territory had another busy tournament schedule with 1 Australian Pro Tour tournament, 6 Australian Money Tournaments, 9 Junior Tour tournaments and 10 Medibank Junior Development Series tournaments.

Australian Pro Tour

The Pro Tour is a series of professional tennis events that act as a bridge between junior events and the ATP/WTA Tour. These events provide an opportunity for players to earn their first World Ranking Points.

Pro Tour events are staged predominantly in regional areas across Australia. The Northern Territory held a single Men's only event in Alice Springs that saw 45 competitors compete.

Australian Money Tournaments (AMTs)

AMTs are semi-professional tournaments introduced by Tennis Australia in 2006. They are designed to create quality match play opportunities and help with the transition of post junior athletes.

The Northern Territory conducted 1 Platinum; 1 Gold; 1 Silver; 1 Bronze and 2 White AMTs.

Of the 6 AMT tournaments, 12 events offered Australian Ranking Points and prize money. 200 competitors entered which is a decrease of 11.89% over the previous reporting period.

Junior Tour (JT)

The JT is an umbrella tour that provides a competition pathway for aspiring junior players. These tournaments offer Australian Ranking points across the 12/U, 14/U and 16/U age groups.

The Northern Territory conducted 1 Gold; 1 Silver; 2 Bronze and 5 White JT tournaments during the reporting period.

Of these 9 JT tournaments, 41 events offered Australian Ranking Points for both boys and girls across the three age groups. 778 competitors entered which was an increase of 34.83% over the previous reporting period.

Medibank Junior Development Series (MJDS)

The MJDS has completed its first full reporting period in the Northern Territory with an outstanding 340 competitors across the 10 MJDS tournaments on offer.

The MJDS sits under the JT in the Competition Pathway and is designed for beginner to intermediate players, giving them their first tournament experience. These tournaments are conducted around Australia.







Competitor Analysis

The following table identifies the number of competitors at each level of tournament. A total of 1,363 Australian Ranking Points opportunities were accessed. This was an increase of 18.83% over the previous reporting period.

SKYCITY Darwin Open

Now in its fifth year under the directorship of Tennis NT, the SKYCITY Darwin Open AMT Gold and JT White attracted 63 entries across eight events, with representation from New Zealand, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, Western Australian and from across the Northern Territory. This was a decrease of 8.69% compared to last year.

SKYCITY NT Open Championships



The 87th NT Open Championships, which was an AMT Platinum and JT Silver, attracted 106 entries across sixteen events. This was an impressive 43.24% increase compared to last year, with representation from New Zealand, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria, Western Australia and from across the Northern Territory.

Two new NT Open Champions were crowned and their names etched into the Parap Cup (Men's Trophy) and Barden Trophy (Women's Trophy).


The Men's top four seeds progressed comfortably to the semifinals, however both matches where lengthy encounters which saw the lower ranked seeds progressing to the final.

It was tournament third seed, Kaden Hensel QLD that prevailed in the final over a battle worn Matt Langley SA, who was still recovering from his marathon three setter the day prior. Hensel victorious 6-1 6-0.

The Women's draw saw the second and third seeds progress to the final after very different semi-finals. Isabella Holland QLD accounting for unseeded Michaela Haet NSW 6-2 6-2, while Jaimee Gilbertson QLD reversed the finals results from a week prior defeating Dianne Hollands NZL 7-6 2-6 6-2.

In the battle of the Queenslander it was Holland who showed her experience to get an early service break to lead 3-0, however Gilbertson fought back to level at three all. History would suggest that an extended battle was likely; unfortunately it did not prevail, with Holland running away with the set and the match 6-3 6-1.





Governance



INPEX Annual Industry Workshop

As part of its engagement with stakeholders, Tennis NT conducts a Workshop immediately following the Annual General Meeting seeking feedback as well as profiling expected changes that will impact the local delivery of the sport.



The primary theme for the 2012 Workshop was strategic planning and consultation off the back of Tennis Australia's presentation of T 16 (targets and priorities) for 2012-2016 within both Participation and Performance.



Scott Draper and Rohan Fisher from Tennis Australia both travelled to Darwin to discuss the direction of Tennis Australia within Participation space along with the various services being provided to the Northern Territory. Steve Rossingh the Northern Territory Government also attended Workshop and presented the findings of the Government's review of tennis in the Northern Territory.

The various points of discussion at the Workshop were aligned to *T 16* and the achievement of goals which are Northern Territory specific and nationally aligned.

Significantly the primary focus of the *T 16* strategy is to increase the number of people playing. It was agreed that with innovation, the right people and well managed facilities the Northern Territory could play its' role in contributing to the delivery of the national targets.

The focus on participation includes an emphasis on the MLC Tennis Hot Shots program and Tennis in Schools, while on the performance side more intensive, individualised coach development is emphasised along with facilitating the establishment of each centre's own player development priorities designed to enhance their environment.

It was agreed operational implementation ideas would be sought from the Centre Managers' Workshop scheduled in March 2013.

Note 1

Summary of Accounting Policies

The accounting policies adopted by the Association are stated in order to assist in a general understanding of the Financial Statements. These policies have been consistently applied except as otherwise indicated.

Reporting entity

The Association is not a reporting entity because in the Board's opinion there are likely to exist users who are able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy all of their information needs, and these accounts are therefore "special purpose accounts" that have been prepared solely to meet the requirements of the Constitution and the Associations Act.

Accounting policies

The Financial Report has been prepared under the historical cost conventions and does not take into account changing money values except to the extent that they are reflected in the revaluation of certain assets. In order for the Financial Report to present fairly the state of affairs of the Association and the results of the Association for the year, Australian Accounting Standards have been adopted to the extent disclosed in this note.

Government Grants

Government Grants are brought to account as income when the Association receives them. Unspent Grants are transferred to an appropriate liability account.

Assets

Asset purchases that have a life of greater than one year are capitalised and depreciated over the period of the estimated useful life of the asset. The etimated useful life for the assets purchased is three years for computer and IT equipment and five years for plant and equipment.

Employee Entitlements

The amounts expected to be paid to employees for their pro rata entitlement to annual leave and long service leave are accrued annually at current pay rates.

Income tax

The Association is of the opinion that it is not subject to income tax.

Note 2

Investment

The investment is currently held at People's Choice Credit Union, previously named Australian Central Savings & Loans.

Note 3

Prepaid Expenses

This is made up of insurance allocations to the next financial year – both Workers Compensation insurance and the National Insurance Program. The correct financial treatment for insurance was introduced in the previous financial year.

Note 4

Loan Receivable

Alice Springs Tennis Association Incorporated received a loan of \$15,000 to assist its facility upgrade that was undertaken in 2010. A Loan Agreement has been exchanged. The Loan will be repaid within 10 years. Under the Agreement loan payments will commence 18 June 2015.

Note 5

Property, Plant and Equipment

Umpires chairs were donated to the Alice Springs Tennis Association. The net book value of these is disclosed as a donation in the Profit and Loss.

Income Received in Advance

\$1,700 DTC Sports Nationals Incentive Sponsorship (remainign from prior year-funds not spent)

\$6,962 Tennis Australia Grant for Medibank Junior Development Series

\$2,327 National Insurance Program receipts from Affiliates now allocated to the correct period in

line with the treatment of the related cost.

Note 7

Officials Development Fund

In 2010, Tennis NT was successful in securing \$2,845.60 of 'unclaimed monies' from the dissolved *Northern Territory Tennis Umpires Association*. This group ceased to function during the period 1996-97 and the remaining funds held in their bank account were surrendered by the bank in 2004 to the *Australian Securities and Investments Commission*. The money is held in trust for Officials Development.

Note 8

Feasibility Study - Territory Tennis Centre

In 2005, \$50,000 was committed to progress the development of a *Territory Tennis Centre*. At various stages funds have been expended to design concept drawings to enhance the case.


Note 9




