Dispute Resolution Procedure for Players

Players are responsible for their game of tennis (not parents/spectators).

Players requesting assistance regarding score disputes, inappropriate line calling, badsportsmanship or inappropriate behaviour (form other players, spectators, or parents are to:

- Advise your opponent that you wish to call for the Venue Supervisor to help resolve the issue.
- 2. Place your racquet on the court to signify that you are seeking Venue Supervisor's help.
- 3. Report this to either the Venue Supervisor directly or through their team manager who will alert the Venue Supervisor.
- 4. Parents or spectators (unless the team manager) are not to call the Venue Supervisor onbehalf of the player or interfere.
- 5. The Venue Supervisor will assist players in resolving the issue.



PLAYER RESPONSIBILITIES

- The server should announce the game score before starting a game and the point score prior to serving for each point and must be loud enough for his/her opponent to hear.
- All balls on your side of the net are your responsibility to pick up and return directly to the server.
- The receiver should not return the first service if it is an obvious fault - - let it go by or ground it.
- Screaming regularly and loudly, whether in relation to winning and/or losing a point is likely to causeinterference to play on nearby courts and may be considered unsportsmanlike.
- Constant overt celebration directed at an opponent may be considered intimidation.
- Players are always expected to shake hands (or tap raquets) with their opponent(s) at the completion of a match.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators, including parents and coaches in making line calls, or attempting todetermine the score or other on-court matters.
- Wait until a point is over before walking behind a court where a match is in progress.
- To retrieve a ball from another court or to return a ball to another court, wait until the players have completed a a point.
- Do no stall, sulk, or complain
- Practice the principles of fair play
- In doubles, when returning service, the partner of the receiver should call the service line for him/her. The receiver should call the centre and side service lines. The call need to be loud enough to stop theiropponents/partner playing.
