## Tennis Queensland Primary Schools Cup - Red Ball

The Tennis Queensland Primary Schools Cup is a mixed team competition for Queensland Primary Schools which uses modified equipment and numeric scoring.
This competition is divided into 2 divisions. Division 1 (mixed and girls only) is the competition pathway for teams wanting to qualify for the State Final held at Brisbane Tennis.

Division 2 is about encouraging participation, providing a fun, social playing experience and giving students the opportunity to represent their school in a team environment.

## Equipment \& Court Specifics:

- 21,23 or 25 inch racquets * 23 inch recommended - any racquets above this size cannot be used
- Low compression (25\%) red tennis balls
- 3 m and 5.5 m Tennis Hot Shots nets as required; alternatively, barrier tape may also be used
- Drop down lines as required


## Teams:

- Students in Year 4 and below enrolled in the school
- Teams can be all boys, all girls or mixed gender
- 8 players per team with up to two substitutes
- Schools can enter multiple teams (one teacher required per school plus one manager per team to assist in the supervision of matches)
- Small schools with a combined enrollment of no more than 200 may enter a combined team. For example: 2 schools of 100 students can combine students to form one team
- All players to wear their school sports uniforms or team shirt
- Players can only enter in one coloured event-red, orange or green and should be entered at their developmental tennis level rather than chronological age
- A Student can only enter one qualifying event E.g. Division 1 (mixed gender or girls only) or Division 2


## Court Setup:

- Red ball tennis court (doubles and singles)
- Doubles court (x2): 5.5 m in width by 10.97 m in length; if 5.5 m nets are unavailable join $2 \times 3 \mathrm{~m}$ nets together, 10.97 m alternatively barrier tape may also be used if you have limited nets
- Singles court ( $x 4$ ): 3 m in width by 10.97 m in length ( 3 m net)
- Courts to be set up the following way depending on the number of courts (tennis, basketball, etc) available and the number of teams competing (see diagram)
- Use drop down lines to mark court area and allow a 1m gap between red courts


## COURT SET UP



## Format of Competition for District, Region \& State Championships:

- Timed numeric scoring
- A Round Robin format, each match will run for 30 mins with eight 3-minute-rotations of four singles and two doubles rubbers
- After each rotation players of Team 1 move one spot to their right, all players of Team 2 move two spots to their right. This is done to guarantee different match-ups throughout play. All Substitutes are to be on court each round. Arrows on the net indicate movement and direction
- At the end of each rotation (rubber), the child with the most points will raise their hand (if the game is drawn, both players must raise their hands). Each won or drawn rubber is awarded 1 point. The team with the most points after 8 rotations wins the match
- Matches can be played in a single round robin format or in pools in case of large participation numbers


## Rules of Competition:

- To begin, players play paper, scissors, rock and the winner chooses to serve or receive
- Serve to be a drop bounce hit over the net, with the receiver allowing the ball to bounce once before returning. There is no second serve
- Players alternate serves
- Serve must bounce before the singles sideline or yellow drop-down line
- If there is a 'Let' (meaning the ball hits the net and goes in) play continues
- No volleys (ball must bounce)
- Matches are timed ( 3 min ) and scored numerically e.g. 1-0, 1-1, 2-1, 3-1, 4-1 etc, timing may be adjusted in the event of hot weather
- Server to call out the score BEFORE each point. If there is a dispute, please replay the point or ask for the Court Supervisor. Pegs are used to assist with scoring
- When the siren sounds to end the match, players finish the rally then shake hands. The player with the most points will raise their racquet, if there is a draw both players raise racquets. The Court Supervisor will then record scores from rubber e.g. 6-2

- Use of appropriate Tennis Hot Shots Red Ball modified equipment (court dimensions, nets, balls, racquets)
- All events must use the same competition format as described above
- Maximum team entries per school:
- Division 1 (Mixed) - 1 team
- Division 1 (Girls Only) - 1 team
- Division 2-4 teams

The Tennis Queensland Primary Schools Cup is a mixed team competition for Queensland Primary Schools. Each school has the opportunity to nominate teams at Regional Ties throughout Queensland. Winners at each Tie are then invited to compete at the State Final at Brisbane Tennis.

## Competition Structure

## Equipment \& Court Specifics:

- 50 \% compression orange balls
- $3 / 4$ tennis court $-6.4 m \times 18.29 m-$ singles and $8.23 m \times 18.29 m$-doubles
- Drop down lines as required
- Winners from all regional ties qualify for the State Final


## Teams:

- Students in Year 5 and below enrolled in the school
- Teams can be all boys, all girls or mixed gender
- 4 to 5 players per team
- Players must be ranked in order of their singles ability
- Small schools with a combined enrolment of no more than 200 may enter a combined team. For example: 2 schools of 100 students can combine students to form one team
- All players to wear their school sport uniforms or team shirt
- Each team requires a separate manager
- Players can only enter in one coloured event- red, orange or green and should be entered at their developmental tennis level rather than chronological age
- Maximum team entries per school:
- Division 1 (Mixed) - 1 team
- Division 2-3 teams
- If entry numbers for a division are not adequate for sufficient matchplay, divisions may merge.


## Court setup:

- Orange ball tennis court (singles and doubles)
- Court Dimensions: 6.4 m width $\times 18.29 \mathrm{~m}$ in length
- Use drop down lines to mark $3 / 4$ court area

- Full sized tennis court
- Winning team from all regional ties qualify for the State Final


## Teams:

- Teams can be all boys, all girls or mixed gender
- 4 to 5 players per team
- Players must be ranked in order of their singles ability
- Small schools with a combined enrolment of no more than 200 may enter a combined team. For example: 2 schools of 100 students can combine students to form one team
- All players to wear their school sport uniforms or team shirt
- Each team requires a separate manager
- Players can only enter in one coloured event - red, orange or green and should be entered at their developmental tennis level.
- A student can only enter one regional qualifying event - eg. Division 1 (mixed gender or girls only) or Division 2
