GUIDELINES FOR VENUE SUPERVISORS

~	Deal with the players (not parents/spectators)
~	Wear some type of identification
~	Always be available
~	Let people know where you are
~	Be seen regularly around the courts
~	When no officials are present, players must accept opponent/s decision
~	When a dispute or argument develops, you can be called to the court for disputed line calls or decisions on the rules, as well as score disagreements
~	Receive and consider information and views from others, and if appropriate, forward on to appropriate channels

Other things to watch for:

- Outside interference, spectators, parents, coaching
- Use common sense in dealing with situations and decisions, have the ability to communicate, be even tempered, patient and in control
- Be positive, exercise consistency
- Have knowledge of the rules
- Be aware of the Extreme Weather policy (https://www.tennis.com.au/doc/extreme-weather-policy)
- Be approachable and communicate with players in a calm, adult fashion

If for whatever reason you need to leave the venue, appoint a deputy if possible
