



TENNIS TASMANIA BOARD VACANCY

Public Call for Expressions of Interest

OVERVIEW

Tennis Tasmania is calling for nominations to fill two Member elected and one Board appointed Director positions.

ABOUT THE ROLE

The Board, comprising six elected and up to three appointed directors, is responsible for overseeing the governance and strategic direction of Tennis Tasmania.

The board typically meets 6 times per year, across Tasmania, in Campbell Town or virtually from 4.30pm – 7.30pm on a Wednesday. Board members are expected to attend the annual general meeting (AGM), club and community forums, and the awards function that follows the AGM.

Director positions are voluntary.

SELECTION PROCESS

Candidate information will be provided to all members for completion of an election process, if required, by the 2022 AGM. The Board appointed position recruitment will occur after the 2022 AGM.

Tennis Tasmania supports and encourages a diverse range of applicants to express interest in the roles. The Board seeks to have a broad representation (including but not limited to gender, age, regional representation, diversity, skills, and experiences) of Directors to represent tennis in Tasmania.

ESSENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

All Directors are required to hold current and valid:

- Working with Vulnerable People Card (Tas) (or other Australian State/Territory equivalent); and
- National Police Check (within the last three years).

All Directors must also sign the Member Protection Policy declaration and any other required policy of Tennis, including, but not limited to the Tennis Board Background Check Policy.

POSITIONS AVAILABLE

Tennis Tasmania is seeking suitable candidates to be elected for two positions each with a three-year term. Candidates are also sought for the Board Appointed Director for a maximum of a three-year term with preference given for appropriate skills in one or more of the following areas:

TENNIS CLUB / COACHING EXPERIENCE

A Director with tennis administration (club and/or coach-based experience) and who can bring insights to inform decisions relating to the needs of clubs, coaches, and participants.

LEGAL EXPERIENCE

A Director with experience in the law, an understanding of law integrity, governance, and strategic and public policy.
