## **Country Week Event Conditions**

- 1 This event shall be played in accordance with the ITF Rules of Tennis except where altered by the regulations and conditions as follows.
- 2 This event shall be open to players who are registered participants of a Tennis Club, Centre or Association in country areas.
- Team entries must be accompanied by the appropriate team fee or evidence of payment (eg. EFT payment) and the team entry form must be signed by the team captain.
- Each team may nominate up to eight players only. The names of the players nominated must appear on the team entry form. Unless prior consent has been obtained from the Tournament Director, any team playing a non-nominated player, in any match, shall forfeit the set(s) that this player has played.
- Teams may nominate in A, B Special, B, C Special or C grade, but the final classification and grading is at the discretion of the Tournament Director. In all grades, teams may be divided into two or more sections.
- When a Club, Centre or Association has multiple teams entered, a nominated player cannot play in a lower grade than the team they are nominated for unless prior permission has been obtained from the Tournament Director.
- When a Club, Centre or Association has two or more teams in the same grade, a player having played three matches with a team in that grade is then tied to that team only. Said player can play up in a higher graded team, but not down or across to another team.
- 8 All matches in all grades are to be doubles only with each pair of one team playing both pairs of the opposing team.
- 9 For all matches, one team is the Home team and the other team is the Away team.
- All rubbers in all grades shall play an 8 game set, 7 all tie-break in the rounds, semi-finals and finals. No ad deuce ("sudden death deuce") will also be played in all sets (receiver's choice).
- The personnel of the teams shall be nominated prior to the commencement of each match by recording their names on the official score sheet provided, and no alteration to the personnel of the team shall be allowed during the progress of a match except for illness, injury or other sufficient reason, and then only with the permission of the Tournament Director. Should the Tournament Director approve the substitution of another player, the team is to forfeit the uncompleted set and the substitute can take such player's place in the remaining unplayed set only
- 12 If a team is 10 minutes late reporting to the Tournament Box for their match after being called, the team at fault shall lose 1 game for each 5 minutes thereafter and lose the first scheduled set 8-0 if unable to commence play within 30 minutes following the team being called. If a team is unable to field a complete team 60 minutes after the scheduled time of play, that team shall forfeit the match and no points shall be awarded to that team.
- If a default is made by any team without, in the opinion of the Tournament Director, sufficient cause being shown, their opponents shall receive 6 points for a win, and shall be credited with 4 sets, 32 games and the match count for that teams players for finals eligibility.
- All round matches will be of 3 hours duration. E.g. 9am to 12 noon. When time is called by the Tournament Box, matches are to finish (the game currently being played is to be completed only).
- Teams must only use courts allocated for that match. Where available, a share court may also be used for some matches
- The winner of each match shall be decided by the number of games won, and if the games be equal, then by the numbers of sets won. A point shall be awarded for each set won and two points awarded for winning the overall match. No points shall be awarded for a bye. No point(s) shall be awarded for an incomplete set, however, the games won will tally to the overall game total of the match
- At the conclusion of each match, the captain of the winning team must hand in the official score sheet, signed by both team captains, to the Tournament Box. Should an addition error be discovered by the Tournament Box, the Tournament Director may call one of both Team captains to the Tournament Box to resolve any error. The Tournament Director reserves the right to amend the match result without consultation with the team captains.
- In the event of any teams in a grade being equal on points at the conclusion of the rounds, the ladder shall be decided by total sets won and if equal, by the percentage of games won over games lost. If still equal, then the head to head result of the teams will be used to determine the placing. Should no head to head result exist, one pair nominated by each team shall play a tie-break to decide the higher placed team. All nominated players for this tie-break must met the eligibility to participate in the semi-finals.
- To be eligible to participate in semi-finals or final, a player must have played in a minimum of three matches with that team. No player may play in more than one semi-final or final. In all finals matches in all grades, should rain interfere and cause matches to be abandoned after they have commenced, the following will apply: unless an overall team win result has been obtained, the team finishing higher on the ladder in the rounds, shall be declared the winner. Should finals be unable to be commenced, then the team finishing higher on the ladder in the rounds shall be declared the winner. Should there be a draw in any finals match, the first named pair on the score card shall play a tie-break to decide the winner of the match.
- 20 Tennis Australia approved tennis balls shall be used throughout the event.
- 21 Correct tennis attire must be worn. Tennis attire logos must not contravene Tennis Victoria or the Event sponsors.
- 22 Conditions 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10 and 19 may be altered at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- Any team that enters and participates in one or more match and then forfeits without reasonable cause may be fined \$100 for each match forfeited. Permission to forfeit can only be given by the Tournament Director.
- 24 Conditions of play for players All matches shall be played under the ITF Rules Tennis as adopted by Tennis Victoria, Tennis Australia's
  Procedures for Matches without a Chair umpire, and the Tennis Australia Code of Behaviour. The Tennis Australia National Extreme Weather
  Policy shall also apply.
- In the case of a team withdrawing because of forfeit, an average of points (to 2 decimal places), will be allocated to each of the remaining teams in this section, and will be added to their overall points total, after all round matches have been played.
- 26 Team Captain's declaration: I hereby give Tennis Victoria the unconditional right to use at it's discretion, photographic pictures and personal information on me in any form of media, art, advertising, trade, visual documentary, promotional material, merchandise or film coverage of any kind without compensation to me or further approval by me.
