In keeping with our commitment to keep you up to date with happenings onsite at Adelaide Shores, please find below a summary of upcoming community events and activities.

We also pleased to advise that following extensive consultation relating to improvements to West Beach road, a number of possible short term options have been identified. The West Beach Trust is currently working with the City of Charles Sturt to trial one of these options, which would require all traffic exiting the West Beach Recreation Reserve onto West Beach Road from Diamond Sports to turn left. The trial is expected to be in place prior to the Master Games in October this year.

## Football Federation of South Australia

## Bay to Birdwood

Barratt Reserve is once again playing host to the iconic South Australian community event – The Bay to Birdwood. This year the event is on Sunday 27th September, with set-up to commence from Friday 25th September. Please note West Beach road will be closed in an easterly direction between approximately 7.00 am and 11.00am on day of the event.

## Diamond Sports

The new Diamond Sports facility will be officially opened on the evening of Friday 2nd October. Marking the occasion, spectators are expected to attend games on the three main diamonds immediately following the official opening.

## Masters Games

Adelaide is again playing host to the Master Games this year, with Adelaide Shores to host the baseball and softball fixtures from Saturday 3rd October through to Saturday 10th October, with day and evening matches programmed throughout the period. There will also be some live entertainment in the evenings between 6pm-9pm.

## Pacific School Games

In keeping with Adelaide Shores commitment to grassroots sport, it will be providing the venue for the football, softball and baseball components of the Pacific School Games, from Saturday 21st to Sunday 29th Nov. The Pacific School Games provides opportunities for around 4000 school-aged students from across Australia to participate in nine different sports. During this period Barratt reserve will be fenced off for exclusive access by the schools, with both day and evening games.

## Football Centre

Works to enhance the look of the Football Centre have been undertaken with fencing installed along the northern side of the main building following requests from residents and tree plantings along the northern and eastern boundaries. Sealing of the car park at the south of the Pitch will commence this year.

## Diamond Sports Facility

As part of the Diamond sports facility, a new training centre and a change/administration facility are in the process of being developed. These are located west of the existing softball grandstand and clubroom. Over 50 new trees have been planted to enhance the look of these new diamond sports facilities.

## Surf Life Saving Club

Adelaide Shores has been working with the West Beach Surf Life Saving Club (WBSLSC) to help alleviate the significant storage issues they have. As such the WBSLSC is looking to develop a storage shed behind the irrigation shed located in the south west corner of the Football Centre.

The storage shed is 17.25m x 15.35m in size, will be the same colour as the existing irrigation pump shed and be accessed via the new road developed for the car parking east of the Football Centre. Access will only be required when picking up and dropping of equipment i.e. boats and skis which will most likely be stored on their trailer in the shed. They are hoping to have the facility developed for access early in their season.
