

Asia-Pacific Australian Open Wildcard Play-off Policy October 2012



The Asia-Pacific Australian Open Wildcard Play-off (AWP) provides an opportunity for players in the region to earn their spot in the 2013 Australian Open Main Draw.

This is a great opportunity for players in the region and Tennis Australia (TA) is pleased to host the inaugural event in Nanjing, China. Please note that there are some conditions in regards to the Asia-Pacific AO Wildcard Play-off and entry into the 2013 Australian Open.

1. The winners of the Men's and Women's Singles will earn a place in the 2013 Australian Open Main Draw. This is non-transferable.
2. The winners of the Men's and Women's Doubles will earn a place in the 2013 Australian Open Main Draw. This is non-transferable.
3. The winners of the Men's and Women's Singles and Doubles must still enter the 2013 Australian Open Main Draw to be eligible for their respective wildcards.
4. If a winner of the AWP becomes injured and / or cannot play in the 2013 Australian Open for any reason, except automatic entry on his / her own merits, then TA will retain the wildcard and will use the wildcard at its own discretion.
5. If a winner of the AWP in singles or doubles is accepted into the main draw on their own merits then Tennis Australia will reserve the right to use the wildcard for the 2013 Australian Open at its own discretion.
6. The wildcard that is won by the respective players in singles and doubles is non-transferable and there is no condition where this wildcard can be transferred from one player to another.
7. The winning doubles team at the AWP must enter together to be eligible for the 2013 Australian Open wildcard. There is no conditions where these players can receive the wildcard but not play together.
8. If one of the doubles winners becomes injured, even if the doubles partner is fit to play, the wildcard will be returned to Tennis Australia to use at its discretion.
9. If the event is cancelled for any reason, either in full or part, TA reserves the right to use the wildcard at their discretion.

We hope you enjoy the inaugural AWP and we wish all the participants the best of luck for the event and for the remainder of the year.
